Scrolling Up and Down a Web Page

Some web pages are long and much of a web page can be hidden from view. There are several ways to scroll down and back up a page.

<u>First, you can use your mouse if it has a wheel built into it.</u> Just left click on the web page anywhere, then turn the wheel to go down or back up a web page.

Alternatively, there is a vertical thin rectangular bar on the extreme right that runs pretty much the length of the window vertically with a smaller rectangular or square bar inside of it that moves up and down as you scroll through a page. (1) If you place the moving mouse cursor just below the smaller bar and left click the mouse once, the screen will move one page down. If you place the moving mouse cursor above the smaller bar, it will move the screen one page up. (2) You can also place the moving cursor directly on the smaller bar, left click the mouse and keep it pressed down, now you can move the smaller bar up and down with the mouse and see the screen page move up and down. (3) On the extreme top and bottom ends of the vertical bar, you will notice a small black triangle pointing up at the top of the vertical bar, and a small black triangle pointing down at the bottom of the vertical bar. If you place the moving cursor on either triangle, you can click once and see the page move up or down one line at a time, or you can keep the left button of the mouse down and watch the page scroll up and down as long as you keep the mouse button pressed down.
